Beyond Past and Future in World Children's literature



Kimberley Reynolds OBE specializes in Children's Literature Studies. She was President of the International Research Society for Children's Literature 2003-7 and in 2013 received the International Brothers Grimm Award for contributions to the subject. Kim sits on a number of influential boards and committees in the UK and internationally. She was a founding member of the UK Children's Laureate and advises on various children's literature broadcasts, programs, films, blogs and other projects including the British Library and British Council. Her major publications include Radical Children's Literature: Future Visions and Aesthetic Transformations (2007), Left Out: The Forgotten Tradition of Radical Publishing for British Children, 1910-1949 (2016).



Xiangyu Wu teaches children's literature at the Humanities College of Zhejiang Normal University, a higher education institution directly under the Chinese Ministry of Education. He is also the director of the Center for Children's Literature which boasts the largest scale in China. His main research fields are children's literature, children's culture, language education and children's education. His major books include Evidence, Path, and Reflection on the Interdisciplinary Expansion of Chinese Children's Literature in the Last Century (2020), which explores Chinese children's literature for 100 years and Chinese Children's Literature Chronicle Study (1908-1949) (2014).



Jong-Chan Won is a professor at the Department of Korean Language and Literature at Inha University and a leading researcher of children's literature in Korea. His collection of reviews Children's Literature and The Spirit of Criticism(2001) has been published 11 times over 20 years, and has established itself as a must-read book in the world of children's literature. His critique of children's literature contributed greatly to rearranging the genealogy of children's literature history and contributed to enhancing the literary quality of children's literature. He served as the president of The Korea Association of Literature for Children and Young Adults, and is actively conducting public lectures for teachers and parents as well as research on children's literature. His major books include Issues in Korean Children's Literature(2010) and The Old Future of Children's Literature(2020)



Elisabeth Rose Gruner is a professor of English at the University of Richmond, in Richmond Virginia, where she teaches children's and young adult literature, Victorian literature, and creative nonfiction writing. Her research focuses children's and young adult literature and education, particularly in relation to minoritized statuses. She is the former Associate Dean of Arts and Sciences and Director of Academic Advising Services as well as the founding Director of the First Year Seminar Program at the University of Richmond. She is also the current past president of the Children's Literature Association, an association dedicated to the academic study of literature for children. Her major publications include *Constructing the Adolescent Reader in Contemporary Young Adult Fiction* (2019).
